Kids are back in school and the barn busyness has shifted to the afternoon, late evening hours. Trainers have updated the boards to reflect these schedule changes. If you have the luxury of not working during the day, please try and come out during the day and ride or schedule your lesson before 4:00p.m. or after 7:00p.m. if you can. I just want everyone to prepare themselves that the winter hours are coming so please review your client hand books for winter hours on the facility and in the arena.

I am experimenting in the arena this year by allowing four trainers at a time to train. I will keep a close eye on this to see if it will work. We may find it's just too much and the clients aren't getting a good lesson. I will keep you posted on whether this will work or not. My biggest concern is the clients' lesson time and that they can hear their Trainer when there are three other Trainers trying to talk at the same time. Trainers are required to keep the schedule board up to date daily if possible so our clients can work around the busyness. The trainers have also been informed that if the lesson is not on the schedule board then I will be exiting that lesson from the arena. Please help your trainer out by making sure you are on the board in the right slot so you can have the best lesson possible. FALL SHOTS

On Monday September 19th, all horses at EEC are scheduled to receive a FLU/RHINO vaccine. Time scheduled is between 1:00p.m. and 2:00p.m., so they can go out for the day. NEVC will administer vaccine to every horse on the facility unless we hear otherwise. If you would like to use a different vet please email Melissa or Kellie so we can remove you from the list. Weather permitting horses should go out on the 19th & 20th with light afternoon work on the 20th. De-worming will commence after the 1st frost which should be sometime around mid October. We will buy the wormer and just bill everyone so they can be done at the same time.

FEED ROOMS

We have had some real issues this year with leaving the feed rooms open for air flow. Even though there are half doors closed people are still going into the back area. We had a client's child go back in the feed area chasing a cat and they climbed the hay and thought the hay went all the way back but went through the wash bay ceiling instead. The child fractured a foot and was very lucky it was not more. We also have a couple of houdini horses that get out of their stalls and like to let other ones out as well. We have locks on their stalls but somehow they still get out. No one knows for a while until they are in the feed room eating grass or grain off the truck or they get into someone else's grain. Jose has been told by me the feed room doors are to be closed and the garage door down with a little gap at the bottom from this point forward. If you need to drop off feed, or supplements please bring them to my office and I will make sure they get to the right place.

FANS

Fans are scheduled to come down by October 1st. We will take your fans down for you and set them in front of your stall(s). Once you clean them off and wrap your bungee cords around the handle, please set them next to your tack closet and we will store them in the back room in the north barn. Please remember to put your horses name or yours on your fans so we know whose fan it is.

CONSTRUCTION PROCESS

We still have a lot of finishing work to do on the barns that have new roofs but are main concern is to get the roofs replaced before winter. We are really running behind schedule due to all the rain we've had but will still try and keep the schedule of roof replacement for the new arena which is September 14th thru the 25th. A lot of Trainers will be gone during this time. The inside arena will be closed during this time frame and all we can do is hope the weather is nice and you can use the outdoor arena's.

BLANKET CLEANING
